ELIZABETH ZEITOUN is Research Fellow at the Institute of Linguistics, Academia Sinica (hsez@gate.sinica.edu.tw). Her major research interests lie in Austronesian linguistics, morphosyntax, typology, and historical linguistics. She has published a number of sketch grammars in Chinese, two books in English on Mantaoran Rukai (Zeitoun & Lin 2003; Zeitoun 2007) and another on Saisiyat (Zeitoun et al 2015). She specializes in Rukai, Saisiyat, Tsou, Kanakanavu and Saaroa and has worked on nearly all the Formosan languages. She was the founder of the Formosan Language Archive (2001-2014) and Acting Editor and later Executive Editor of Language and Linguistics from April 2008 through June 2013. She was granted the Wu Dah-you award in 2004, and twice the outstanding research award (NSC 2010 and MOST 2015). She has been training aborigines since 1997 and is involved also in revitalization work.
